THE EASTER TRIDUUM

Holy Thursday

“With the celebration of Mass on the evening of Holy Thursday “the Church begins the Easter Triduum, and recalls the Last Supper, in which the Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, loving unto the end his own who were in the world, he offered to the Father his Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine and gave them to the Apostles as spiritual nourishment, and he commanded them and their successors in the priesthood to perpetuate this offering”.

Good Friday *“On this day, when “Christ our passover was sacrificed”, the Church meditates on the Passion of her Lord and Spouse, venerates the Cross, commemo-rates her origin from the side of Christ on the Cross, and intercedes for the salvation of the whole world.*

On this day, in accordance with ancient tradition, the Church does not celebrate the Eucharist; Holy Communion is distributed to the faithful during the celebration of the Lord’s Passion alone, though it may be brought at any time to the sick.”
